



Continuing Education Credits

The 2017 CVC Kansas City program has been submitted (but not yet approved) for a maximum of 36 hours of credit for veterinarians in full attendance and 29 hours of credit for technicians over four days in jurisdictions that recognize AAVSB's RACE approval. 
